Both Preston Allen, Interim Vice President for Student Affairs and I, Kathleen Enz Finken, Provost, reviewed the input the Student Success Fee Allocation Advisory Committee (SSFAAC) gathered from students, student groups and student organizations as well as the survey results regarding priorities and needs from the students' perspective. We also engaged our managers – Vice Provosts, Deans, Directors, and Associate Vice Provosts – in discussions about how best to focus these dollars on student success.

The attached spreadsheet reflects our proposal for the use of the Student Success Fee funds and is being submitted for your consideration and approval. In some cases the allocation being proposed does not reflect full year funding but rather a pro-rated amount based on projected hire/start dates.
